Budget Update FY 16-17: For the month of June, the Accounts Receivables (\$41,074) includes the ONI invoice for the 4th quarter, a BES invoice, BP&S Cleanup Reimbursement, the WMSWCD Connect PDX grant and several advertising invoices. We will spend down all of our ONI grant funds by using any surplus for the all household newspaper and room rentals as approved.

New Fiscal Year 17-18: We submitted our request for the ONI Grant Advance of \$89,747 on July 7th and it was received on July 20, 2017. We also received notice that WMSWCD has awarded SWNI \$20,200 in Partnership Funding for the Stormwater Stars program. SWNI's fiscal fee will be \$2,000. Hilary and I met with WMSWCD and BES this week to revise the budget for this project as the original ask as for \$30,000. In addition there will be a meeting on August 26th to review roles and responsibilities with all grant partners.

PBOT Portland in the Streets Community Grant Program: PBOT has \$100,000 available to community and neighborhood groups for safety, beautification and trail projects. Information Workshops will be held: July 26th at APANO; July 27th at Peninsula Park Community Center, and August 2nd at Metro. Times and locations were sent in an email this week. Please note that if you wish SWNI to be a fiscal sponsor you need to contact us in advance of submitting the grant proposal. Grant applications are due August 31, 2017.

Southwest Corridor Plan: Ryan Curren is the project manager for the SW Corridor Equitable Housing Strategy. Ryan is working with housing advocates and other city partners, including Tigard, Metro and Portland Housing Bureau, to develop a unified, strategic approach to housing for the corridor. (website:<https://www.portlandoregon.gov/bps/73445>) Ryan will be giving a presentation at SWNI's E&I Committee meeting on Monday, July 31, 2017. SWNI Program Coordinator John Tappero is participating on the SW Corridor Equitable Housing Strategy Committee.

Movies in the Park – Four neighborhood associations are hosting Movie events. The Markham/Public Safety event on July 9 had an estimated 750 attendees. Crestwood's Dickinson Park on July 16th had about 500 people. Bridlemile's movie at Hamilton Park went very well, but I haven't received an estimated count yet. Sunday, July 30th is Maplewood's Movie in April Hill Park. In addition to the all-household newspaper, electronic newsletters, website and Facebook postings, all the movies were shared with PPS parents in SW Portland through an account that Markham NA established.

Hillsdale Business and Professional Pancake Breakfast: Sunday, July 30st from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.

National Night Out: 15 neighborhoods are hosting NNO events or neighborhood picnic. The August newspaper also has promotional materials as well as our electronic SWNI August news. SWNI is providing picnic supplies and event equipment per requests. Sara Freeman is coordinating all requests

Multnomah Days – Saturday, August 19th. SWNI has secured a permit for the parade, a noise permit, and street banner. We are working on the application for the Street Closure, including signatures from all business and affected residents. The pancake breakfast will start at 8:00 am, the parade will begin at 10:00 am. The front parking lot of the Multnomah Arts Center will be used to host the Central Precincts Open House equipment demonstrations and free ice cream. Multnomah NA will have a booth on Capitol Hwy and the Watershed Resource Center is coordinating about eight stewardship booths.

Summer Concerts in Willamette Park – The concerts have been held every Wednesday night in July. Tonight (July 26th is the last event). WRC Manager Hilary Hunt is staffing an information booth and Laura Campost from SWNI E&I Committee is coordinating a children's Native American craft activity. Concerts have had about 500 people attending.
