

## Southwest Neighborhoods Transportation Committee Action Plan 2019-2020

SWNI empowers citizen action to improve and maintain the livability of Southwest neighborhoods.

Committee purpose: The Transportation Committee acts as a forum in the community to address transportation issues in southwest Portland and in other places as they affect southwest Portland. The term transportation is defined broadly to include all modes of transportation, including but not limited to the modes of motor vehicles, pedestrian, bicycle, transit, and freight. Such modal uses may take place in rights-of-way and on public and private property, and include travel on trails. More specifically, the committee:

- Participates in transportation system planning and policy-making at the neighborhood, community, and city-wide, regional, and state levels; and reviews and recommends as appropriate.
- Participates in project planning for streets in southwest Portland.
- Participates in promulgation of codes and laws that implement transportation goals and policies.
- Advocates for funding for transportation projects.
- Assists SWNI neighborhood associations with transportation related issues in recognition of the connection among transportation, land use and stormwater management, participates in land use and stormwater management issues as they relate to transportation.
